## ON FOOT

Some buildings in downtown Seattle allow walk-through public access during business hours. With Seattle's steep hills and rainy days, these amenities are treasures.

Pedestrian skybridges and tunnels connect buildings and businesses above or under the street. Retail establishments are generally happy for customers to use their entrances, exits, bridges and tunnels.

Looking for a view? Smith Tower and Bank of America Tower viewing platforms are available to the public for a small fee **OR** use the one on the 40<sup>th</sup> floor of the City's Key Tower at no charge.



## METRO BUS

The downtown bus tunnel has five underground stations with a combination of handicap and non-handicap accessible entrances. Visit Metro's Customer Service Centers in the Westlake bus tunnel and King Street Center, just west of Union Station.

## BIKES ON THE BUS

Every Metro bus has a bicycle rack that accommodates two bikes. Load or unload at any bus zone at any time except in the Ride Free Area, 6AM to 7PM. During these hours, load and unload your bike at the Metro stop nearest the edge of the Ride Free Area. Contact Metro Customer Service for more information at 206.553.3000.

**Chinatown-International District** (206.382.1197) and **Pioneer Square** (206.667.0687) offer similar validation programs.

**Pike Place Market** offers free parking for up to 60 minutes at the 1531 Western Avenue garage.
